
COVID-19 Pandemic Update

SECOND WAVE CASES

- During the second wave, our cases have increased by 842%.
- There have been 556 cases in the second wave so far, compared to just 66 cases in the first wave. While this is cause for concern, it should be noted that First Nations have always stamped out the virus when it has reached their communities.
- There was a spike in cases throughout the month of October, but the curve began to bend in early December.
- Throughout the month of December, another spike in cases began to occur.
- We saw a rapid increase in cases throughout Ontario after the holidays, and a slight decline in new cases in the last couple weeks.

CONFIRMED CASES BY COMMUNITY

Please note: We have reformatted our chart to show total cases by geographical region.

- 25 of the new cases are reported this week are from communities that were previously at zero for quite some time.
- As of today, 47 out of 133 First Nation communities have had at least one case during the second wave.
- The South West region has experienced the most cases of COVID-19.
- The current total resolve rate is 85%.
 - This is a 19% increase from last week
- Currently there are **87 active** COVID-19 cases within First Nations communities, which is close to the amount reported last week.
 - 12 communities currently have active cases:
 - Six Nations
 - Akwesasne
 - Aamjiwnaang
 - Wauzhushk Onigum
 - Kettle and Stony Point
 - Oneida Nation of the Thames
 - Walpole Island
 - Beausoleil
 - Ginoogaming
 - Constance Lake
 - Delaware Nation at Moraviantown
 - Wahta
