First Nations COVID-19 testing in Ontario: Weekly report 39

Key messages:

- The <u>153 new positive results</u> among First Nations people in the week ending Jan 10, 2021. This is 2.5 times the total for last week which, until this week, was the highest total to date. This increase is consistent with the fears that there was more socializing over the holiday season.
- The increases in positive results were spread across all regions, with lower relative increases in Northeast and the Central region.
- As expected with the return to normal business hours after the holidays, testing volume among First Nations increased considerably over the past week.
- The slightly higher positivity rate among First Nations people extends the trend of increases to 7 consecutive weeks although it remains lower than the overall positivity rate across Ontario.






COVID-19 Test results over time




The rolling twoweek average of new COVID-19 positive test results among FN increased dramatically.




Test volume increased in the past week back to the pre-Christmas levels, likely due to the return to normal business hours following holiday season.



The week of Jan 10, 2021 is the 7th week in a row with slight but steady increases in the rate of positive test results among First Nations people.



There were 835 COVID-19 positive test results among First Nations as of Jan 10, 2021. This is due to an *increase of 250%* over the previous week.



All areas except for Northeast and Central regions had large increases (25%+) in positive results over the past week. This is the second week in a row where Central had lower increases than other regions.

Technical notes:

Data source: Characteristics of COVID-19 diagnostic test recipients among the Ontario First Nations population, ICES

Intervals in the reported data: Data are as of the week ending on the date shown with the exception of June 20, Jun 26 and Jul 4 for which data for First Nations are for the previous 5, 6 and 8 days, respectively, due to changes in reporting period. Data for Ontario and First Nations for week ending Aug 30, Sep 7, Sep 13, Oct 12 and Oct 18 are for 8, 8, 6, 8 and 6 days respectively (with weekly test volume prorated to 7-day rate).

Rolling average of new positive results: Data for each week is the average of the current and previous week. The rolling average ensures compliance with data suppression rules that preclude release of values less than 5. Data for Jul 18 and Aug 1 are based on averages of the previous and following weeks of both dates, to correct for known data quality issues.
